Field Day Site Visits

TBG Homesite

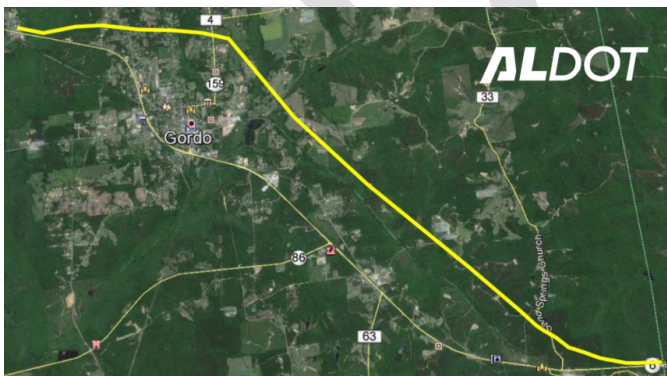

The Gordo Bypass (ALDOT Highway 82 Construction)

The Gordo Bypass Project of US-82 is an ALDOT project over 8 miles long beginning at the Tuscaloosa County line and extending into Pickens County. The project will improve safety, mobility, and local commerce, and has an expected completion date of early summer 2027. You will hear from Will Thompson, ALDOT Stormwater Manager, and others about the project.



Northport Main Avenue Improvement Project (LID Construction)

Northport, Alabama is actively revitalizing its historic downtown through the **Main Avenue Improvements Project**, partnering with Main Street Alabama to boost local infrastructure, connectivity, and community growth. The project includes the use of porous pavement. Participants will be able to see completed project areas as well as active construction.



Polyacrylamide Demonstration

Just outside the Synergic Center, field day participants will hear from the experts about the proper use of Polyacrylamides. Dr. Mike Perez of the Auburn University Stormwater Research Facility, and Seva Bray of Applied Polymer Systems Inc. will demonstrate the proper selection and use of polyacrylamides to reduce turbidity in construction stormwater runoff.



USGS Hydrologic Instrumentation Facility
